**OFFICIAL RULES FOR
MIXED TEAM EVENTS
AIR RIFLE
AIR PISTOL**

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. DISCIPLINE

Rifle and Pistol.

2. TYPE OF EVENT

Mixed Team.

3. NAME OF EVENT

10m Air Rifle Mixed Team, 10m Air Pistol Mixed Team.

4. NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS IN EACH TEAM

Two (2) athletes from each nation.

One (1) man and one (1) woman – participants in the individual events.

A maximum of two (2) teams per nation is allowed. No mixed nation teams are allowed.

5. BIB NUMBER IN QUALIFICATION STAGE

Athletes will retain the same BIB numbers, as those of the competition.

6. NUMBER OF STAGES

Three (3) Stages:

- Qualification Stage
- Semifinal Stage
- Medal Matches

7. QUALIFICATION STAGE

The allocation of the athletes in the Qualification Stage will be decided by draw. The members of the same team shoot from the neighboring positions (the woman at the left of the man position). The competing teams are positioned side by side.

8. NUMBER OF SHOTS IN QUALIFICATION STAGE

Preparation and Sighting Time: 10 min.

Twenty-five (25) shots by each member of the team (in total fifty (50) shots) in 30 min.

9. SCORING IN QUALIFICATION

- Rifle: decimal (ISSF Technical Rules).
- Pistol: full ring with inner tens (ISSF Technical Rules).

10. RANKING AFTER QUALIFICATION

The ranking in the Qualification Stage will be the combined results of the two (2) members of the team of each nation (one (1) man and one (1) woman).

11. TIE IN QUALIFICATION STAGE

Tie for any position will be broken as per the ISSF Technical Rules.

12. SEMIFINAL STAGE

The top eight (8) teams after the Qualification Stage proceed to the Semifinals. The Semifinals will take place at the Final's range.

The top eight (8) teams will be divided in two (2) Semifinals of four (4) teams according to the Qualification ranking.

The first Semifinal

The teams ranked: 1, 4, 5, 8.

The second Semifinal

The teams ranked: 2, 3, 6, 7.

The allocation of the athletes in Semifinal Stages will be decided by draw.

The members of the same team shoot from the neighboring positions (the woman at the left of the man position).

The competing teams are positioned side by side.

13. SCORING IN SEMIFINAL

Decimal scoring.

Scoring starts from zero (0). The ranking will be decided by the combined result of the two (2) members of the team of each nation (one (1) man and one (1) woman).

14. NUMBER OF SHOTS IN SEMIFINAL

Preparation and Sighting Time: 3 min.

First Elimination Stage

Two (2) series of three (3) shots (in total six (6) shots) by each member of the team in 150 sec. Followed by two (2) shots in 100 sec.

The lowest ranking team is eliminated.

After another two (2) shots in 100 sec. the next lowest ranking team is eliminated.

Second Stage

After the elimination of the 3rd ranked team, the remaining two (2) teams will continue to shoot two (2) shots to complete the Semifinal (in total twelve (12) shots).

The winner teams of the Semifinals will qualify for the Gold Medal Match.

The two (2) teams in 2nd place of the Semifinals will qualify for the Bronze Medal Match.

15. RANKING AFTER SEMIFINAL STAGE

The two (2) eliminated teams of the two (2) Semifinals will be ranked in 5th to 8th places according to their Semifinal results.

16. TIE IN SEMIFINAL STAGE

A tie for elimination will be broken by shoot-off as per the ISSF Technical Rules. Each team will appoint from its two (2) members, the athlete who will shoot-off (either man or woman), in a time limit of 10 sec. to decide, who will shoot, by raising the hand, otherwise a zero will be given.

In case of a tie, for the 5th to 8th places, the tied teams will be ranked according to their Qualification ranking.

17. MEDAL MATCHES

The Bronze Medal Match will be shot first, followed by the Gold Medal Match.

18. SCORING IN MEDAL MATCHES

Decimal scoring.

The ranking of each shot will be decided by the combined result of the two (2) members of the team of each nation (one (1) man and one (1) woman). The winning team of each shot receives one (1) point. The winner team has to get seven (7) points with at least a one (1) point advantage.

19. TIE IN MEDAL MATCHES

In case of a tie after a shot, no point is awarded and the next shot must be called.

20. BRONZE MEDAL MATCH

After 4 min. changeover time, the two (2) teams from the 2nd place at the Semifinals will take part in the Bronze Medal Match (positions C and D for the team from the first Semifinal and positions E and F for the team from the second Semifinal).

Preparation Time: 1 min. (no Sighting shot).

50 sec. for each shot.

Duel between the two (2) teams.

After seven (7) points, the winner team will be the Bronze Medalist.

21. GOLD MEDAL MATCH

After 4 min. changeover time, the two (2) teams from the 1st place at the Semifinals will take part in the Gold Medal Match (positions C and D for the team from the 1st Semifinal and positions E and F for the team from the 2nd Semifinal).

Preparation time: 1 min. (no sighting shot).

50 sec. for each shot.

Duel between the two (2) teams.

After seven (7) points, the winner team will be the Gold Medalist.

22. TYPE OF TARGETS

Electronic Scoring Targets for Qualification, Semifinals and Medal Matches.

23. MALFUNCTION

The ISSF Technical Rules will be followed.

24. PENALTIES

In case a shot is fired in the Qualification round, before the command Preparation and Sighting Time start, a penalty of minus two (- 2) points will be given for the first shot.

In finals, any shot taken before any command, will count as zero (0).

Any other penalties will be decided according to the ISSF Technical Rules.

25. COMPETITION RULES

As per ISSF Technical Rules of 2017.

26. ATHLETE'S CLOTHING

It is strongly advised that the athletes from each nation wear the same type and color of clothing.

27. MUSIC AND NOISE

During the Semifinals and the Medal Matches, music and noise will be allowed; the Technical Delegate must approve the music program.
